<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. At or about 0900 (EDT) open county ARES net and create roster of stations, indicating capability:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Non-grid power,b. NBEMS (fldigi, etc.),c. Winlink (VHF, HF, telnet),d. NTS.2. Create county ARES report, TEST PRIORITY precedence, for Ohio Section Emergency Coordinator N8BHL, using fldigi Plaintext or Radiogram form, indicating:<ol style="list-style-type: none">a. Number of stations on the net at time of report, number on non-grid power, NBEMS capable, Winlink RF capable, and NTS capable,b. Number of shelters expected to operate in the afternoon (PART B), andc. Your ARES group's favorite videoconferencing system for staying connected during pandemic.3. Relay county ARES report to your District net. If your District is not operating a net for message relay, send an HF (75m SSB, 80m NBEMS) capable station to Buckeye Net with your message for relay to N8BHL.4. By 1300, complete individual station survey for American Red Cross: callsign, emergency power availability and type, bands used (indicate simplex or repeater), indicate whether digital or voice traffic moved. Use SURVEY 123 https://arcg.is/P9iCX.			
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis:			
<p>Operate as if 12 hours after loss of power and internet service. If your repeater system has backup power that will last for 12 hours, use it. If the repeater's power would be out, operate simplex!</p>			
<p>Get information to the Section Emergency Coordinator. This is not an Ohio EOC operation, so W8SGT is not in operation. We will therefore use ARRL Ohio Section Buckeye Net for relay of messages to and from N8BHL. Think of Buckeye Net as a combination of "3902" for voice control of the net and OHDEN for movement of traffic. Stations going to Buckeye Net will need the Signal Operating Instructions (SOI) and probably like the fldigi macro set supporting the SOI. See the message routing Concept of Operations, attached to this document and always available at https://docs.google.com/document/d/1B41pJiLtPmritpJFPfz17cVdENHZVqpktYllm7AvnyA/edit?usp=sharing.</p>			
<p>Buckeye Net will be in operation for relay of SEC traffic 0900-1200.</p>			
General Situational Awareness			
<p>May 30, 2020</p>			
<p>At 0900 (EDT) KG4ARC will send an ARC 213 to the ARES Liaison, Regional Coordinator and Divisional Clearinghouse and Hams that have participated in the preparation of the Simulation asking them to mobilize ARES ops to prepare for an impending disaster in their area (e.g., a power outage, due to hacking, in their hometown that takes out not only power but cell service and internet) and go to shelters in their areas where Red Cross is expecting infrastructure disruptions. <i>[Reminder: no shelters will be activated; this is just the hypothetical scenario. The reality is that you will be operating from your own home or other safe space.]</i></p>

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ICS 202 Incident Objectives

Purpose. The Incident Objectives (ICS 202) describes the basic incident strategy, incident objectives, command emphasis/priorities, and safety considerations for use during the next operational period.

Preparation. The ICS 202 is completed by the Planning Section following each Command and General Staff meeting conducted to prepare the Incident Action Plan (IAP). In case of a Unified Command, one Incident Commander (IC) may approve the ICS 202. If additional IC signatures are used, attach a blank page.

Distribution. The ICS 202 may be reproduced with the IAP and may be part of the IAP and given to all supervisory personnel at the Section, Branch, Division/Group, and Unit levels. All completed original forms must be given to the Documentation Unit.

Notes:

- The ICS 202 is part of the IAP and can be used as the opening or cover page.
- If additional pages are needed, use a blank ICS 202 and repaginate as needed.

Block Number	Block Title	Instructions
1	Incident Name	Enter the name assigned to the incident. If needed, an incident number can be added.
2	Operational Period <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Date and Time From • Date and Time To 	Enter the start date (month/day/year) and time (using the 24-hour clock) and end date and time for the operational period to which the form applies.
3	Objective(s)	Enter clear, concise statements of the objectives for managing the response. Ideally, these objectives will be listed in priority order. These objectives are for the incident response for this operational period as well as for the duration of the incident. Include alternative and/or specific tactical objectives as applicable. Objectives should follow the SMART model or a similar approach: S pecific – Is the wording precise and unambiguous? M easurable – How will achievements be measured? A ction-oriented – Is an action verb used to describe expected accomplishments? R ealistic – Is the outcome achievable with given available resources? T ime-sensitive – What is the timeframe?
4	Operational Period Command Emphasis	Enter command emphasis for the operational period, which may include tactical priorities or a general weather forecast for the operational period. It may be a sequence of events or order of events to address. This is not a narrative on the objectives, but a discussion about where to place emphasis if there are needs to prioritize based on the Incident Commander's or Unified Command's direction. Examples: Be aware of falling debris, secondary explosions, etc.
	General Situational Awareness	General situational awareness may include a weather forecast, incident conditions, and/or a general safety message. If a safety message is included here, it should be reviewed by the Safety Officer to ensure it is in alignment with the Safety Message/Plan (ICS 208).
